FWA Writing Contests for 2022

One more month to enter your work

There are two open writing contests sponsored by FWA for adults; the submission period for each started Feb 1 and ends April 30.

- To enter either contest you need to be an FWA member. You can sign up at https://www.floridawriters.org/
- For the **Collection contest**, a book of short stories FWA publishes every year, you can submit two short stories, each no more than 1200 words. The stories must be based on the theme of the year, which for 2022 is "thrills and chills." There is no fee for entering, but you must be an FWA member. The book publishes 60 stories, out of the 200+ typical number of entries. The top 10 of those published this year will be decided by WLOV's Barbara Rein, who won top book of the year award last year for her *Tales from the Eerie Canal*.
- For the **Royal Palm Literary Awards**, there are over two dozen categories you can enter. However, each individual is limited to five submissions Your work may be published or unpublished. There is a fee for each submission, which goes up each month, with April being the highest. Note also that FWA stops accepting entries when the total submitted exceeds 550. Royal Palm Literary Awards


Royal Palm Literary Awards (RPLA) is a prestigious writing competition that recognizes extraordinary writing in 28+ genre categories for adults and 4 for youth and provides objective and constructive written assessments to all entrants.

Poem	A Poem is a composition, usually in verse, designed to convey experience, ideas, or emotions in a vivid and imaginative way. Characterized by the use of language chosen for its sound and suggestive power and by the use of literary techniques, such as meter, metaphor, and sometimes rhyme. Free verse also fits into this genre. This generally nonrhyming form allows for greater experimentation with such poetic conventions as meter, punctuation, and format.	No	Max 75 lines

FAPA Book Awards Deadline Coming Up End of April!



The submission deadline for the Florida Authors and Publishers Association Presidents Book Awards is April 30, 2022. There are 37 categories with bronze, silver, and gold medals awarded in each category. All submissions are digital. (Authors don't have to send in hard copy or actual books.) The awards recognize book publishing excellence in content, design, and production. The judges are librarians and book

industry professionals. Judges' reviews are available on request. Awards will be made at the FAPAcon 2022 conference in Orlando on July 30, 2022.

On February 28, the WLOV board approved registering with Amazon's nonprofit arm, AmazonSmile, which allows you to support WLOV with a donation on Amazon purchases.

With AmazonSmile, you'll find no change in the prices or the shopping experience, but your payment will **donate 0.5%** to WLOV when you buy eligible items. Eligible products are marked "Eligible for AmazonSmile donation" on their product detail pages. Recurring Subscribe-and-Save purchases and subscription renewals are not currently eligible.

To use AmazonSmile, simply go to <u>smile.amazon.com</u> on your web browser or activate AmazonSmile in the Amazon Shopping app on your iOS or Android phone within the Settings or Programs & Features menu. On your first visit to AmazonSmile, you will be prompted to select a charitable organization to receive donations from your future eligible AmazonSmile purchases. Enter "Writers League of the Villages," and then select it when it appears in the list.

• Use critique groups and workbooks.

WLOV Member Bona Hayes gave an excellent presentation about editing your book. Using examples, personal experience and audience interaction, Bona covered the following essential elements:

• Know Your Target Market (Who is it for and what's it for? Who is your audience, genre, and what is your book's purpose?)

• Do a First Editing. After finishing, rest your manuscript, then listen to the draft from start to finish without making changes.

• Use an automated editing program, e.g., Grammarly, Hemingway, ProWritingAid

- Evaluate. Problem Solve. Revise.
- Use beta readers and professional editors. Know the five levels of editing and samples of each type.





To the Editor:


Rather than hanging out with a small minority of people who spend their days sitting in a bar, Michelle Cottle should have spent her time in the Villages finding out about the thousands of people here who work together raising money for charities. She could have written about the options for intellectual pursuits like the Civil Discourse Club, the <u>Writers League of the Villages</u> and the 1,300-member <u>Villages Genealogical Society</u>.

She did a great disservice to us by positioning the lack of diversity as a reason for people to stay away, rather than mentioning the recent <u>Black History Celebration</u> where Villages residents came together to learn more about the accomplishments of our African American neighbors.

On my block there are very diverse political opinions, but our first priority is to be good neighbors to each other.




