November is National Novel Writing Month – NaNoWriMo

Have you thought about creating a first draft of your book in one month? If you answered, 'YES, or 'MAYBE', then join me in November for National Novel Writing Month — https://nanowrimo.org

What is NaNoWriMo? It is an online community of writers who come together once a year in November to write 50,000 words. Some say millions join. Some finish. Statistics say about 10-15% actually come up with 50,000 words. And one year I did! The writing wasn't very good, but it served as a start to my novel. Don't worry; nobody reads your writing; you don't share your words; you only share your word count. It is a jumping-off point to get your words written.

There's a certain excitement and a boost to creativity knowing that thousands of writers around the world are creating at the same time as you are. A great way to get the most out of that early motivation is to channel it into higher early output. We all know that 50,000 words split over 30 days is 1667 words a day. But authors who win NaNoWriMo often don't start there. They shoot for 2,500-3,000 words a day in the first week.

I plan to participate this year, and if some WLOV writers want to join me, I'll be at Sumter Landing Panera Bread on Friday, November 1, at 1:00 pm to kick off the challenge. I then plan to be at Panera every <u>Monday</u> in November at 1:00 p.m. We can talk about writing or about our plot. We can do some free writing. We can grumble about the difficulty we're having. We can celebrate our victories. We can just talk. We can just eat and drink! Whatever! Writing is a lonely task and a chance to build a community can be inspirational.

I am going to log my word count daily into NaNoWriMo under the name CardiffGirl. If you sign up (it is FREE) you can see my (hopeful) progress. https://nanowrimo.org

Don and I worked together on the Authors' Beat podcasts interviewing 79 Villages authors. He was the tech guru and I was the host aka 'mouth.' It was an exciting way to help our fellow writers and Don's humor made it a fun experience. At Expo and other events, he would dress up in costume or take photos of visitors before a giant Abe Lincoln and other characters. He was always into some new idea and full of energy and enthusiasm. He aged me. But he also was willing to do what he could to help others and his passion for Israel and world peace. Even in his last months, he would phone me with an idea on how I could promote my Holocaust novels. Some were a bit off-my-style but the point is he was always thinking of ways to help. He was a steady friend of WLOV and I will miss him. He was one of a kind. Thanks, Don.

Don Canaan, 86, originally of the Bronx, NY, died in The Villages, Florida on September 27, 2024, surrounded by loved ones.Don was born in the Bronx in 1938 to Louis and Sally (Sarah) Swerdlow. It was on the streets of New York City that Don spent his childhood and teen years mentally cataloging the price of every item at his local delis, soda fountains, and movie theaters to constantly remind his descendants of in later decades.A lifelong lover of media, Don earned a Bachelor of Arts from City College of New York, Institute of Film Techniques in 1961 and a Master of Arts in Journalism from The Ohio State University in 1984. He followed his passion throughout his career, working as a photographer for the

US Army (1956 - 1963) and as a film editor for NBC News NY, where he earned a Peabody Award for Film Editing on "American White Paper: Organized Crime in the United States." Don's passion for documenting the world around him followed him home, where he lovingly compiled photo albums and home videos of his family and the world outside. A perpetual early adopter of technology, Don was always up to date on the latest home recording, camera, and computer equipment. His online presence and dexterity was unmatched for one of his generation, and he was living proof that you can always teach an old dog new tricks. In retirement, Don continued to pursue journalistic endeavors and delved into the world of fiction writing, publishing multiple novels and stories. He stayed up-to-date on current events, sharing articles and news with his loved ones around the world. He continued his beloved practice of price tracking, always ready to confirm that yes, Walmart did raise the price of Kemp's frozen yogurt by 10¢.Don's sense of humor was spectacular; his family remembers fondly his quick wit and the way he had a song reference or related fact for any topic that was on the table. He was a big fan of mid-century comedians such as Groucho Marx, Jackie Gleason, Tom Lehrer, and Mel Brooks. He was a member of Chabad of the Villages and the Villages Writing Club.Don leaves behind his children Tamar and Golan Canaan, grandchildren Lex Shelton and Aviad and Eden Canaan, along with his devoted ex-wife Mazal (who will miss arguing with him terribly). Fake Amazons

In the past year or so, I've noticed an upsurge in scams that employ the Amazon name, or the names of Amazon trademarks, to try and trick hopeful writers into believing they are working with a company affiliated with Amazon, or even with Amazon itself.

As is common with scams these days, many of these questions come from writers who've been solicited via email or phone (you can see one such story <u>here</u>)–but also from writers looking to self-publish, who googled "self publishing" or "Amazon self-publishing" or "KDP publishing" or a similar search term.


