Why Every Author Needs a Synopsis

and

What's the Difference Between a Synopsis and a Back cover copy?

It's writing competition season and you asked for a book synopsis. So you find your fabulous, succinct, intriguing back cover copy and send that off with your manuscript. **WRONG!**

Your **back cover** copy (sometimes known as the **blurb**) is a teaser. It is written to entice the reader. It's a promotional piece. It doesn't give away the solution. And it is short, fifty words on average.

A **synopsis** is a complete summary of your book. It introduces all the main characters. It highlights the major plot points. It indicates the conflict, the reason for the conflict, and it reveals the resolution -- It shows the ending, the conclusion. A synopsis can be one page or more, between 500 and 2,000 words. The tone is neutral, written in the present tense, and in third person (omniscient voice).

Write your synopsis in chronological order. If your plot has flashbacks, try not to include them in the synopsis, focus on the main plot points. If, however, if your flashbacks are essential, keep the description at a minimum and sandwich it in between major plot points.

For example:

[Plot point] Mary's husband, John Smith, disappeared.

[Flashback] Mary relived the last time he did this

[Plot point] Mary hired private detective, Fred Gumshoe.

A Synopsis can be challenging to write, but it is worth the effort as it serves many purposes.

- Writing competitions ask for them, and not having one disqualifies you.
- A good synopsis helps the competition judge (and possibly influencing your score).
- It is needed in the traditional publishing world.
- It helps the cover artist create a perfect cover
- It's a great check for you on whether your story progression makes sense

Some authors write a synopsis before starting on their manuscript (these are the plotters). Some pantsers (those writers who let the plot unfold as they write) keep a log of each scene change as they go along. This is a wonderful tool to create a synopsis.

A couple of weeks ago I sent out a broadcast email asking who might be interested in participating in the first annual Mt. Dora Book Festival on Saturday, September 20th at the Donnelly House in Mt. Dora. Due to the size of the venue, the event is limited to fifteen authors.

I received thirty-two responses—most of them within the first hour. Based on the response, the festival organizer, Crissy Stile of Barrels of Books & Games in Mt. Dora, formalized the event by renting the facility.

I'll be emailing a registration form within the next couple of weeks. Since space is limited, the initial mailing will go to the thirty-two people who responded to my email. The first fifteen people who send in their checks for \$80 will have a spot.

This is an exciting new opportunity for WLOV authors. If the event organizer judges the event successful, future book festivals may be at larger venues with more exhibitors. WLOV will support the event by creating marketing materials, and I'll act as the event registrar. More information will be provided with the registration form.


PLEASE NOTE: Mt. Dora is a quaint, hilly town with <u>limited parking</u>. Exhibitors will be allowed a short window to unload and transport their books into the venue. They will then be required to find a parking space - often a couple of blocks away. This is not an event for someone with limited mobility unless you carpool.


Mia Merrill was in the audience the night of Sebastian's fateful concert. She loves his music and wants to help him overcome his PTSD and get back onstage, but there's


